CT CONFERENCE OF INDEPENDENT COLLEGES JOINS FOX 61, CONNECTICUT PUBLIC RADIO AND THE CT MIRROR TO HOST AND BROADCAST FIRST GUBERNATORIAL DEBATE OF THE 2018 GENERAL ELECTION

Debate to be broadcast live from 6:00 to 7:00 PM from the University of Saint Joseph on Fox 61 and Connecticut Public Radio on Wednesday September 5th, hosted by Amanda Raus of FOX61 and moderated by John Dankosky of the New England News Collaborative. Raus, Aisha Mbowe of Fox 61 and Mark Pazniokas from the CT Mirror to serve as panelists.

HARTFORD, Conn. (August 16, 2018) -- The <u>Connecticut Conference of Independent Colleges</u> (CCIC) today announced that it will host the first gubernatorial debate of the Connecticut general election on September 5, 2018 from 6:00 to 7:00 PM. The debate will be held at the University of Saint Joseph's Hoffman Auditorium at the Bruyette Athenaeum, 1678 Asylum Avenue, West Hartford CT, and will be broadcast live by Fox 61 and Connecticut Public Radio from 6:00 to 7:00 PM.

The CCIC sponsored event will be hosted by FOX61's <u>Amanda Raus</u> and will be moderated by <u>John</u> <u>Dankosky</u> of the New England News Collaborative. The debate panelists will be Raus, <u>Mark Pazniokas</u> of the CT Mirror and <u>Aisha Mbowe</u> from FOX61. The subject of the debate will be the future of Connecticut's economy.
